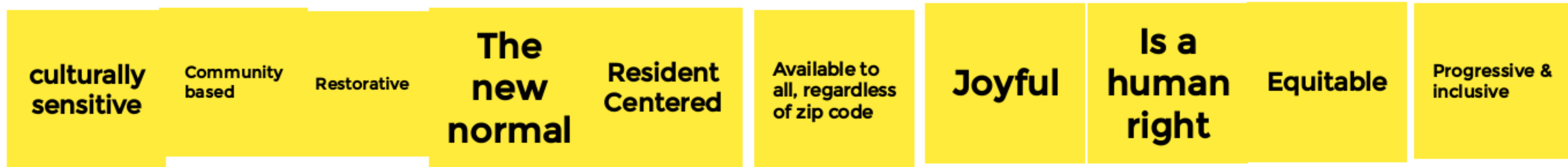

Youth Coordination officer - added to NCO

an ongoing coalition that focuses on this always not just a time limited work group

How to engage formerly incarcerated - this is so important (covid-impact, early release from prison)

a strategy that works on healing for individuals, families, and communities

How to help formerly incarcerated to integrate into society (jobs, health, etc.) impacts safety issues

sharing evidence-based practices, restorative practices in communities - esp. youth

Existing programs/services - preventing or healing trauma -(DOHMH) -- establish a coalition representing across agencies - to inform communities of these resources, connection to local precincts

Having more of those difficult discussions, so if we meet in person, that opens up new opportunities (youthful) to bring them to the table - reimagining that relationship

Centralized source of information for all available resources (resource is sustained) - with easy access to it

In the re-entry realm not using a broad brush to determine what services are funded and focus on addressing the needs of sub populations within the re-entrant population

We also need a connection with 25yrs and up that have been abused by NYPD and reconnect those relationships

We need something that addresses substance abuse

Programs like Bridging the Gap in Red Hook was a monumental success to work on the divide that exist. NCO's were involved and grew deep connections with young people in particular. It also utilizes a restorative circle approach

Increased transparency and periodic, possibly quarterly, report-outs of stats with discussions to interpret stats for the community-at-large

Having police come thru the neighborhood during our events in plain clothes and just kick it with adults

have a group interaction with the youth and police dept. on a monthly base

opportunities for our communities; there's an established link between economic inequality and crime. Developing legitimate methods for improving this situation would go a long way towards having current and future generations be

Activate YLC, MAP meetings - invite youth to participate on our Working Group calls (PO stanton)

the key is for our residents is access to opportunities that address economic mobility
